Lesson: 10 (Part 2)

Passage: Deuteronomy - Survey

Mount Sinai to Kadesh (Deuteronomy 1:6-18)

- Only a 11 day journey.

At Kadesh (Deuteronomy 1:19-46)

- (Deuteronomy 1:26-27) Disobedience and murmuring.
 - Questioning God!!!
 - We do the same thing when difficulties, tragedy, troubles, and challenges come our way. Some ask, “Why is God allowing this to happen to me?”
 - (vv. 29-36) The LORD hears our murmuring. Here we are taught that our murmuring angers God!!!
 - (vv. 34-36) God enters an oath!
 - (v. 36) Caleb would enter **because** he **wholly followed** the LORD. Consider Christ’s words in John 10:27-29.
 - (vv. 41-48) When repentance is TOO LATE!
 - (v. 45) God would not listen to their cries!
 - ★ Proverbs 1:25-38; 28:9; Psalm 18:41; 66:18; Isaiah 1:15; Jeremiah 11:11; 14:12; Ezekiel 8:17-18; Micah 3:4; Zechariah 7:13.

From Kadesh to Plains of Moab (Deuteronomy 2 and following)

- (Deuteronomy 2:24-3:11) God **gives** King Sihon, king of Heshbon, over to Israel to defeat!
 - Consider war and God!
 - (Psalm 33:16-17) It is not the size of your army!
 - (Proverbs 21:31) God gives deliverance - not armies.

→ (Ezekiel 30:20-26) God strengthens those whom He wants to be victorious and He weakens those whom He desires to be defeated.

→ (Isaiah 36:26-27) One would have to meditate on when did God determine the defeats and victories of armies?

- (Deuteronomy 3:21-29) Transition of leadership from Moses to Joshua.
 - Moses asks God to reconsider! What was God’s answer?
- (Deuteronomy 4:5-10) Wisdom is obeying God! READ THIS!
- (Deuteronomy 5:1-21) The second giving of the ten commandments.
 - Two significant changes from Exodus 20.
 - ① The fourth command starts with “Observe” rather than “Remember” in Exodus 20:8.
 - ② The reason for sanctifying the seventh day in Exodus was because God created the universe in six days and sanctified the seventh as His rest. Here, in verse 15, God’s people were to sanctify the seventh day because God redeemed them from Egypt!
- (Deuteronomy 5:27) The people promise to DO what God says.
- (Deuteronomy 5:29) God’s response:
 - ① What the people say is good.
 - ② BUT they do not have the heart to do what they say!
 - HEART: One’s mind, affections (emotions), and will. The heart is who you are! See -----
 - ★ (Genesis 6:5; 8:21) The wickedness of man is . . .
 - ① GREAT
 - ② EVERY INTENT of the THOUGHTS of his heart is . . .
 - ③ ONLY
 - ④ EVIL
 - ⑤ CONTINUALLY!
 - ★ (Jeremiah 17:5-9) Man’s heart is DECEITFUL ABOVE ALL THINGS, and DESPERATELY WICKED!
 - ★ (Proverbs 4:23) We are commanded to GUARD our hearts with ALL DILIGENCE, for out of it spring the issues of life. (See Matthew 12:35; 15:19; James 1:14-15)
- ☆ **MEDITATE:** Deuteronomy 29:4; 30:6; Ezekiel 11:19-20; 36:26-27; Hebrews 8:10.
